



Vince Hafeli has 38 years of experience in the construction industry, with a diverse industry background holding positions as Vice President of Asphalt Plants and Materials for Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, Quality Control Manager for Ajax and various Geotechnical Engineering and Materials Testing firms, and an Assistant District Geotechnical Project Manager for the

Florida Department of Transportation. Currently, he serves as the President of Ajax.

He is an international speaker, author, and advocate for mental health and suicide awareness in the workplace. Using his 38 years of industry experience, lived suicidal experience, and doctoral research, Hafeli is on a mission to educate and revolutionize how mental health and suicide are addressed in the construction industry. He emphasizes that in an industry that constantly discusses safety, it should be okay in the workplace to say, "I am not okay today."



Alan McMillan served as the President and CEO of the National Safety Council (2001-2008) and prior to becoming President, served for six years as the Executive Vice President and COO. He has more than 45 years of government and private sector safety, health and environmental experience, including service with the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration

(OSHA), the U.S. Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) and the Employment Standards Administration (ESA).

McMillan's career began in the Federal Government in 1966 at Eglin Air Force Base, Florida. He joined the U.S. Department of Labor in 1970 in Atlanta as the Regional Human Resources Director, followed by the Regional Administrator for OSHA in both the Chicago and Atlanta Regions. In 1987, he was named Acting Assistant Secretary of Labor for MSHA. In 1988 he was appointed Deputy Assistant Secretary and Acting Assistant Secretary of Labor for the ESA. McMillan served as Deputy Assistant Secretary and Acting Assistant Secretary of Labor for OSHA (1989-1992) where he was responsible for policy, planning and the day-to-day OSHA operations including safety and health standards, voluntary compliance and directing OSHA's nationwide enforcement responsibilities. In 1990, President George H.W. Bush awarded him the Presidential Award for Distinguished Executive Service, the Federal Government's highest award for Senior Executives.

In October 1992, McMillan joined the Los Alamos National Laboratory in New Mexico, where he led the organization's safety, health, and occupational medicine activities. He later assumed the position of Deputy Associate Director of the Laboratory's Environmental, Safety, Health and Quality programs.

He has served on the Boards of Directors for the Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce, the US/Mexico Chamber of Commerce, the Chicago Yacht Club and the Pensacola Yacht Club. He has also served on the Consumers Advisory Council of Underwriters Laboratory, the Board of Advisers to the Center for Business and Public Policy at Georgetown University in Washington, DC, the Advisory Council to the Secretary of Energy for Environment, Safety and Health, and was appointed by the Secretary of Labor to the National Advisory Committee for Occupational Safety and Health. He served as Co-Chair of the Management delegation to the United States/European Union Biannual safety and health negotiations.

Since retirement, he has served as President of the Star Lake Homeowners Association, Commodore of the Pensacola Yacht Club, Rear Commodore of the Gulf Yachting Association and member of the Board of Directors of WSRE public television. He is a Trustee and current President for the 501c(3) Satori Foundation. He has served as Chair of both the Safety at Sea and the Risk Management committees for the United States Sailing Association. He has also chaired the Offshore Council of the Gulf Yachting Association. He served for three years on the Mass Transit Advisory Committee and was Vice Chair on the Restore Act Advisory Committee to the Escambia County Board of Commissioners.

SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

ASJMSF Scholarship Distinguished Recipient—High School

Trevor Turnquist, the valedictorian of Montverde Academy in Montverde, Florida, is this year's **Distinguished High School Recipient** of the Andrew Scott Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation's \$7500 Scholarship. Trevor is the son of Jill and Scott Turnquist, Senior Territory Manager for American Cast Iron Pipe Company. Graduating summa cum laude with a weighted GPA of 4.48, Trevor is a National Merit Commended Scholar and earned the AP Scholar with Distinction Award both his Junior and Senior year. With this scholarship, Trevor will enroll at the University of Florida as a freshman and plans to pursue an undergraduate degree in Computer Science & Electrical Engineering, with the intent of pursuing a career as in artificial intelligence and robotics.

With his exemplary straight-A grades, Trevor was inducted into the National Honor Society his sophomore year and was an Honor Council member throughout high school, serving as President his senior year. He received college credits by passing the Advanced Placement exams in Calculus, Computer Science, Physics, Psychology, Comparative Government, Computer Science Principles and US History. ASJMSF Scholarship Distinguished Recipient—College School

A former ASJMSF Scholarship Distinguished High School Recipient, **Michael Cohen** graduated from American Heritage School in the top 10% of his class with a weighted GPA of 5.52, taking demanding Advanced Placement courses while participating in many extracurricular activities, including varsity football. November 2020 (while on a fork lift at Consolidated Pipe & Supply), Matt Cobb started a non-profit named "Matt's Mission" to increase the survival rate in sudden cardiac arrest victims through AED donations, education and training. Matt has donated more than 20 AEDs and done multiple CPR training classes. Matt has also traveled to Tallahassee and Washington DC to support legislation promoting AEDs and CPR training. Matt also convinced the Orange County School Board to mandate electrocardiograms on every student athlete before playing school sports. His efforts no doubt saved the lives of the 20 student athletes flagged as having a life-threatening condition after their EKG was performed.

Larry Falls, Associated Construction Products

Larry Falls breadth of charitable contributions has been extensive during his 35-year career. Since January 2020, he has donated in excess of \$315K to a myriad of organizations, including Make a Wish, Habitat for Humanity, COVID-19 Pandemic Relief Funds, Hurricane Ian Disaster Funds, University of South Florida, Leukemia & Lymphoma Association, Pig Jig (Nephcure) and various memorials. Larry also volunteers his time with many of these organizations.

James "Jay" Genschaw, Ferguson Waterworks

Jay began a "Homeless Outreach" this past year, utilizing his own funds to purchase backpacks and filling them with essentials: toothbrush and paste, deodorant, body wipes, snacks, protein bars, water, first aid items, dry shampoo, socks, Visa gift card, sunscreen, hand sanitizer. Jay drives around on the weekends search for those in need of supplies and respectfully distributes the essentials. Jay is authentic, wants nothing in return and says he feels blessed to have overcome personal circumstances and is merely "paying it forward."

Vince Hafeli, Ajax

Vince Hafeli, President of Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, is passionate about employees' physical and mental well-being because of his lived experiences. Vince has been recognized in the field for internationally promoting mental health and suicide awareness in the Construction Industry, presenting all over the US as well as England, raising awareness for suicide rates in the industry. Vince spearheaded the Construction Hike for Hope in conjunction with American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. The inaugural Hike for Hope raised \$117,360 and 153 participants registered. The Hike took place in five locations across the state and Vince's goal is to turn this into a national hike in 2024. Vince presented a nationally- recognized "Suicide Proclamation" at the Florida Transportation Builders Association annual construction conference earlier this year. Vince reached out to industry leaders including contractors, engineers, equipment manufactures and consulting firms to sign the proclamation to declare that they would put an extra emphasis on mental health and suicide awareness at their respective firms. In total he received 31 signatures. The proclamation is now a virtual document and can be signed

electronically. Vince hopes to gain one million signatures.

Petticoat-Schmitt's CEO, Ryan Schmitt, and COO, Lauren Atwell, have individually and collectively supported life-changing organizations, programs, and events by donating their time, expertise, and/or financial contribution. Both invest in the future of the industry by engaging in activities such as the ACE Mentor Program, Construction Career Days, University of North Florida's Construction Programs, and other activities that support and encourage young minds to learn and grow. The Mastercraft Build Group, several little leagues and athletic associations, numerous construction-related career programs, and activities offered through NUCA of North Florida, are just a few additional examples of the 45 different charitable organizations and programs supported over the years, with Petticoat-Schmitt's financial contributions reaching \$250,000.
